“Pure goals can never justify impure or violent action”

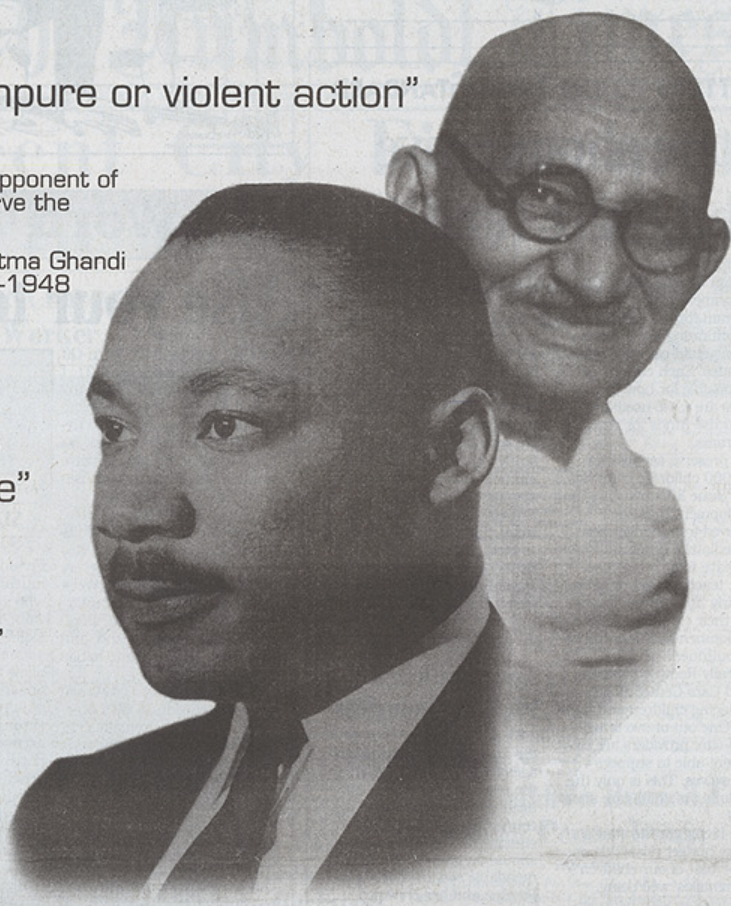

“Have a clear intent, clear tactics and specific targets. Identify the perpetrators and target them, not the system in general.” - EarthFirst!

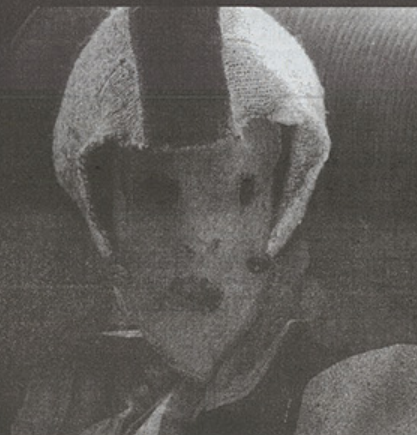
